About Orlando:

Dutch publishing house Orlando started almost 10 years ago as an imprint of AW Bruna Publishers. Founder Jacqueline Smit bought the imprint and since 2017 Uitgeverij Orlando bv is an independent publishing house, with Ingrid Meurs as co-owner and co-publisher since 2018. Both Jacqueline and Ingrid each have more than 25 years of experience in publishing and are now rebuilding the Orlando list, publishing literary fiction and some non-fiction titles by mostly, but not exclusively, female authors, around 20 titles a year.

We aim to bring the best stories from around the world to readers of Dutch, so that means around 70% of our books are translations, and we are building our list of Dutch authors. We explore modern American and English life with authors such as **Alice Hoffman, Barbara Kingsolver, Sarah Winman, Sarah Moss, Susanna Clarke and Joanna Cannon**; we learn from history with historical novels from **Tracy Chevalier, Diane Setterfield and Madeline Miller**; we celebrate European, African and Asian literature with the likes of **Maryse Condé, Ayesha Harruna Attah, Jo Kyung-ran, Nayrouz Qarmout, Burhan Sönmez, Hemley Boum and Saygin Ersin** and we reach out to our young readers with Instagram poet Rupi Kaur. Also we have launched a literary classics list with novels from **Virginia Woolf, Angela Carter, Simone de Beauvoir, Carmen Laforet, Jean Rhys and Marlen Haushofer**.

Our non-fiction is very diverse, from a book about modern witchcraft to essays about David Bowie's favorite books, to culinary memoirs and inspirational travel stories (like **Mia Kankimaki - The women I think about at night**).
